Strawberry Salsa

1 tablespoon olive oil

2 tablespoons white vinegar or white balsamic vinegar

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups, coarsely chopped fresh strawberries

8 green onions, chopped 2 cups chopped cherry or grape tomatoes

1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro

- Whisk olive oil, vinegar, and salt in large bowl.
- Add strawberries, green onions, tomatoes, and cilantro. Toss to coat.
- 3. Cover and chill for 1 hour.
- 4. Serve with tortilla or pita chips.

Yield: 7, 1/2 cup servings.

One day while working at Peoples First National Bank (1985-1991) in Paducah, I had a very humorous in-person conversation with the Branch Manager.


